

Protect Your Public Lands from

STINKWORT

(Dittrichia graveolens)



PROBLEM PLANT:

- Rapidly spreading non-native invasive species
- Touching can cause skin itchiness or blistering
- Poisonous to livestock
- Found along highways, in parking lots, and disturbed areas
- Spreading to trails, grazing lands, and serpentine soils

IDENTIFICATION:

- Sticky, gummy leaves with powerful aroma of camphor
- Light green, thin linear leaves
- Produces small yellow flowers and fluffy seed heads
- Mature plants spread into a “bushy beach ball” shape, up to 3 feet tall
